Maths: The children will develop their understanding of algebra, area and perimeter and position and movement. There will also be an emphasis on problem solving and developing their reasoning skills using real life maths problems within these areas

Computing: This term computing will focus on develop 'Blogging'-what is a blog, creating a blog and responding to a blog. Work will be linked with our science and history work.

Physical development: The children will develop their games skills for striking and fielding games. They will also learn a Victorian Dance.

Art & Design: We will focus on developing our observational drawing and printing skills linked with William Morris. Children will also be cooking-making bread!

Science: Our Science focus will be Electricity. Children will be carrying out various investigations and writing these up using scientific language and diagrams.

Revolution!

English: We will be developing our understanding and ability to write powerful descriptive writing to build tension and mood through historical narrative. The children will focus on choosing the correct tense for their writing and looking to include a range of sentences in their writing. Children will also be writing biographies and limericks.

History: The historical focus during this topic will be the Victorians with an emphasis on learning about Queen Victoria and her life, Victorian schools, slums and crime and punishment. We will also be studying the Industrial revolution and the effect it had on our lives today!

RE: In RE children will be continuing learning about Salvation and then studying the Easter Story.

PSHE: Over the term children will learn about how to keep themselves healthy-physically and emotionally!

Music: Over the term children will be listening to a range of Victorian parlour songs. **Spanish:** Children will continue learning basic words and phrases in Spanish-asking and answering questions, naming parts of the body and their pronunciation of words.

SATs tests: As you may know, the Y6 SATs tests are due in May. The children will take tests in: SPAG, Reading and Maths (Arithmetic and Reasoning). Writing is monitored by the teacher throughout the year.

Booster groups will continue up to SATs and we encourage the children to share with their teachers any areas they feel less confident in.
