



I am a Warrior!

I am warrior! I am strong, brave and powerful. Meet me in battle. Draw your sword, wield your axe and challenge me if you dare! Invade and attack, Romans versus the Celts, the fight is on...

Discover warring Britain: meet Claudius, Boudicca and Julius Caesar, and find out what the Romans did for us.

Maths:

The children will be learning about place value, addition and subtraction methods and multiplication and division strategies. We will be focussing on the addition operation and number bonds – single-digit addition sums - which will be tested every day.

Art & Design: The children will explore Roman & Iceni coins and create their own using clay.

History and geography: The children will research the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. Children will use a range of source material to answer questions about the past which go beyond simple observations

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Homework:

Homework will be linked to current topic and lessons taught. Children are expected to read every day. We will have the Maths Fact for the half-term (Number bonds to 100). In addition to homework children should be learning their times tables in preparation for the national tests.

English: The children will be writing historical narratives about Boudicca's revolt. Then, we will imagine we are in London's amphitheatre watching gladiatorial conquests. We'll write a commentary script on that. Finally, we'll imagine our lives in Roman London and a Roman Fort, and write a letter detailing our day-to-day experiences.

Science:

We will be investigating if the Romans used toilet paper, and, if they did, which material is best.

Music: We have a drummer coming in to teach the children for 30 minutes every Monday.

Physical development:

Our Covid-safe PE lessons will be slightly different to normal but we will be teaching children some key hand-to-eye and close coordination skills.

Computing: The children will find out about a significant Historical figure and their impact on Roman Britain and present a fact file in PowerPoint.

Religious Education:

This unit will be the children looking at and understanding the Gospels and why they are as important today as they were years ago.
