

# Homework 1



- Homework is given once every half term with suggested activities and projects that are related to our topic. It is not compulsory, but rather is designed to encourage home learning as a collective activity between children and family members. However, there are enough activities for one per week.
- Spelling Test every Friday.
- The children also have usernames and passwords for Times Table Rockstars, an online game which aids times table practice. This is to be done every evening.
- Reading every day for at least 10 minutes. Please remember to ask the children questions about the text. Please see your pack or website for support questions.
- Check your child's school bag every evening. Help them to be organised and also keep you up to date.



### Reading at home

- Your child's will be given two books to read at home for the week. They
  will be assigned a book change day. They will also be assigned books on
  bug club with comprehension questions.
- The school policy is to read with your child ten minutes each evening.
   We will not be using home reading diaries this year, however we will be keeping track of the children's reading progression.
- Your child must have their reading book in school each day, so that they
  can be heard read.
- Please teach your child to respect the school books, they are very expensive.
- If books are repeatedly lost or damaged, we may have to issue a fine.
- Reading mornings will begin on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September. Please arrive at 8.30am. Reading morning will end at 8.45am. It is a chance to share a book with your child

### **School Times**



- 8:45am classroom doors open. Please be on time.
- If your child arrives at school after 8.55am, they will be entered as late and will need to come into school via the school office. All late children must enter via the office and names entered in the late book.
- Please don't leave your child unsupervised! Make sure you drop them off at the door yourself. If you have more than one child to deliver please talk to the class teacher to make safe arrangements for collection and delivery.
- 3:20pm door open home time.
- Children after 3.30pm are taken to the office and recorded a late pick up. You
  will be fined for picking up your child after this time.
- Please do not block classroom doorways children need to leave the classroom safely and confidently. Wait until all the children have gone to speak to the class teacher.
- Passwords may be asked for. This is school policy if we are in doubt. Please
  ensure other adults picking up know the password. Please make sure you have
  returned your form, and that it includes the contact details of anyone who may
  pick your child up. If they are not on the form, we cannot release the child to
  them, even if they have the correct password

### Attendance

- It is important that children attend school regularly.
- They should only be off school for genuine sickness.
- Parents/carers should report child's absence to school office by 9.30am.
- A note is required on return to school explaining absence.
- School holidays are not allowed in school term time.
- The school keeps accurate and up to date records of all attendance.

90% attendance = approx. half a day per week
This will affect their chances of progress and future life chances!

Attendance below 90% means your child will be registered as a persistent absentee by the Local Authority. We expect all children to be above 96%. 98% and above qualifies for a £100 voucher prize draw (98% with no more that 5 lates attendance per term = 1 raffle ticket. 100% = 2 raffle tickets!)



#### Year 1 'Superheroes'

KERPOW! Intergalactic greetings, young heroes. It's time to rescue the planet from evil villains! Who's your favourite superhero? Spiderman? Wonder Woman? Maybe your heroes are ordinary people who've achieved great things...

Maths: Children will be learning 'Number and Place Value'. They will be counting forwards and backwards to 10; counting objects with accuracy; writing numbers to 10 with numerals and words and also understanding what zero represents. They will be developing vocabulary and problem solving when comparing groups by saying and writing fewer, less, greater than and smaller than. After that, they will begin to explore 'Addition and Subtraction within 10'

Art & Design/Design Technology: Children will draw a superhero. They will construct a cone and decorate it to make a 3D superhero mouse. They will also design and make a superhero mask. When investigating and cooking a superfood, they will create a collage of a healthy food plate fit for a superhero!

RE: Children will focus on theme of 'A Time For Giving Thanks'. They will learn about the Christian festival of Harvest and the Jewish festival of Sukkot. They will reflect on God's amazing, wonderful and natural world.

Physical development: Children will be learning about safety and space awareness through superhero movements! They will perform a slow motion sequence exploring blocking, twisting, ducking and dodging. They will use gym equipment to balance, travel over and under to rescue people from evil villains!

Music: Children will be making sounds using percussion instruments to imagine superhero action sequences.

> Homework: Please see the weekly homework newsletters given out every Friday.

English: Children will be learning about nouns and adjectives to label and write descriptive captions for a superhero. They will read and act out a comic strip, identifying structural and textual features that they will attempt to reproduce independently when writing their own simple comic strip story. They will use oral sentence rehearsal and phonic skills to write a short narrative about a real life superhero. At the end of the unit they will use their imaginations to create a superhero animal fact file.

Computing: Children will be taught esafety rules so they know who to tell if something concerns them. They will use a paint program to produce a superhero cityscape montage. They will also create a simple-motion animation based on a comic strip story.

**History:** Children will learn about the story of a special historical hero or heroine.

Superheroes

**Geography:** Children will develop human features vocabulary e.g. city, town, village, farm, house, office, harbour...as setting opportunities for their own comic strip stories.

Science: Children will learn about and investigate the human body for parts, senses and eating healthy. They will explore the similarities and differences between human and animal body parts. They will work scientifically to find out how far a cardboard cone (superhero mouse) will fly by squeezing different sized bottles at different angles to see which makes the greatest difference. They will make predictions, talk about their findings and record observations by drawing and recording measurements onto a simple chart.

#### PSHE:

Children will be learning about how to look after others and how to make school a better place.

#### Year 2



#### Towers, Tunnels and Turrets

See the castle ahead? Get ready to invade its mighty walls! Shoot a projectile with an archer's aim! Head across the drawbridge, over the moat and up to the top of the tower!

#### Maths:

We will be concentrating on numbers up to 100: counting in 2s, 5s and 10s; writing the numbers and understanding tens and units. We will then be moving on to addition and subtraction of two 2-digit numbers. The children will be finishing this half term by starting to look at multiplication.

#### Art & Design:

The children will be making their own models of towers and bridges. The children will be designing and making their models from various materials; to test strength and resilience.

#### RE:

We will be learning about the great variety within creation. The children will learn about the life and beliefs of St Francis of Assisi.

#### Physical development:

The children will learn different balance and co-ordination techniques, by creating their own sports games.

In dance, the children will be looking at simple Tudor dances and creating their own steps.

#### English:

We begin the term with report writing. The children will write their own newspaper reports inspired by the classic fairy-tale, *Rapunzel*. We will also be looking at the story *The Tunnel* and creating our own stories based on the question: What could be at the other end? We will investigate characters and settings. Finally, to end the term we will write a letter to the Fairy-tale Board to complain about the Three Billy Goats Gruff and their behaviour.

Towers, Tunnels and Turrets

#### Science:

This term we will be looking at two areas; living things and their habitats, and everyday materials. We will using this knowledge to design and make towers and bridges, in order to test different materials. The children will be looking at where different animals live, including moles and badgers.

**PSHE:** The children will be learning how to approach different dilemmas and strategies to deal with them.

SRE: The children will learn how to tell the difference between a boy and a girl and to learn the scientific names of body parts.

#### Computing:

The children will be learning about visual programming language using Scratch. They will be using the context of art and drawing, and will be engaged creatively in developing simple animation.

#### Geography:

We will investigate different types of maps and differing structures from countries around the world.
