



This Summer term 2, the Nursery children will be learning about...

How many pebbles on the beach? Which creatures live by the sea? Exploring these questions and more in our topic about the seashore.
How high can I jump? How fast can I run? We will Explore these questions and more in our topic about sport, movement and physical activity.

Maths: During Maths the children will be learning to match numerals to a quantity and counting out a number of objects from a larger group.

Children will be introduced to the concept of and explore length, height and money.

Communication and Language: The children will recreate experiences through role play, using talk to organise and clarify and their thoughts and feelings

The children will explore the meaning of new words through talking about the breadth of their experiences.

Physical Development: The children will continue to develop their skills in staying safe when tackling new challenges.

We will continue to practice name writing and forming these letters correctly ensuring the children are holding writing materials correctly.

During our PE sessions we experiment with different ways of moving and negotiating space successfully.

Literacy: The children will take part in activities that get them interested in illustrations and print in books. They will be encouraged to listen carefully to stories and recall, as well as describing characters and settings.

Expressive Arts and Design: The children will use a range of media and materials to create simple representations of events. They will use simple tools and techniques to assemble and join materials together.

Religious Education/ PSED: The children will be using Spirited play to help them to understand stories from the Christian, Islam and Fable faiths. They will also take part in activities that encourage confidence to talk to others and play within a group, being confident to talk about themselves positively.

Understanding the World: The children will be taking part in activities where they have to talk about things they have observed. They will look closely at similarities, differences and change, commenting and asking questions.
